Today, however, the gods seem to be facing obstacles with their daily tasks and could use some assistance! Are you ready to help them? Be brave and let the adventure begin!

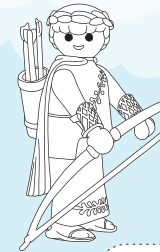

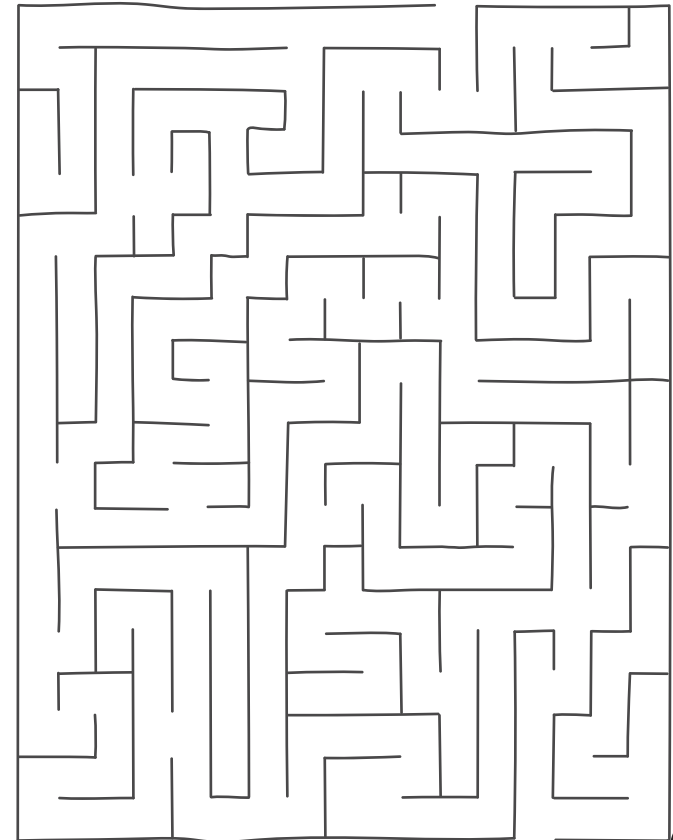
Artemis has got lost in the woods!
Help her find the right way out!



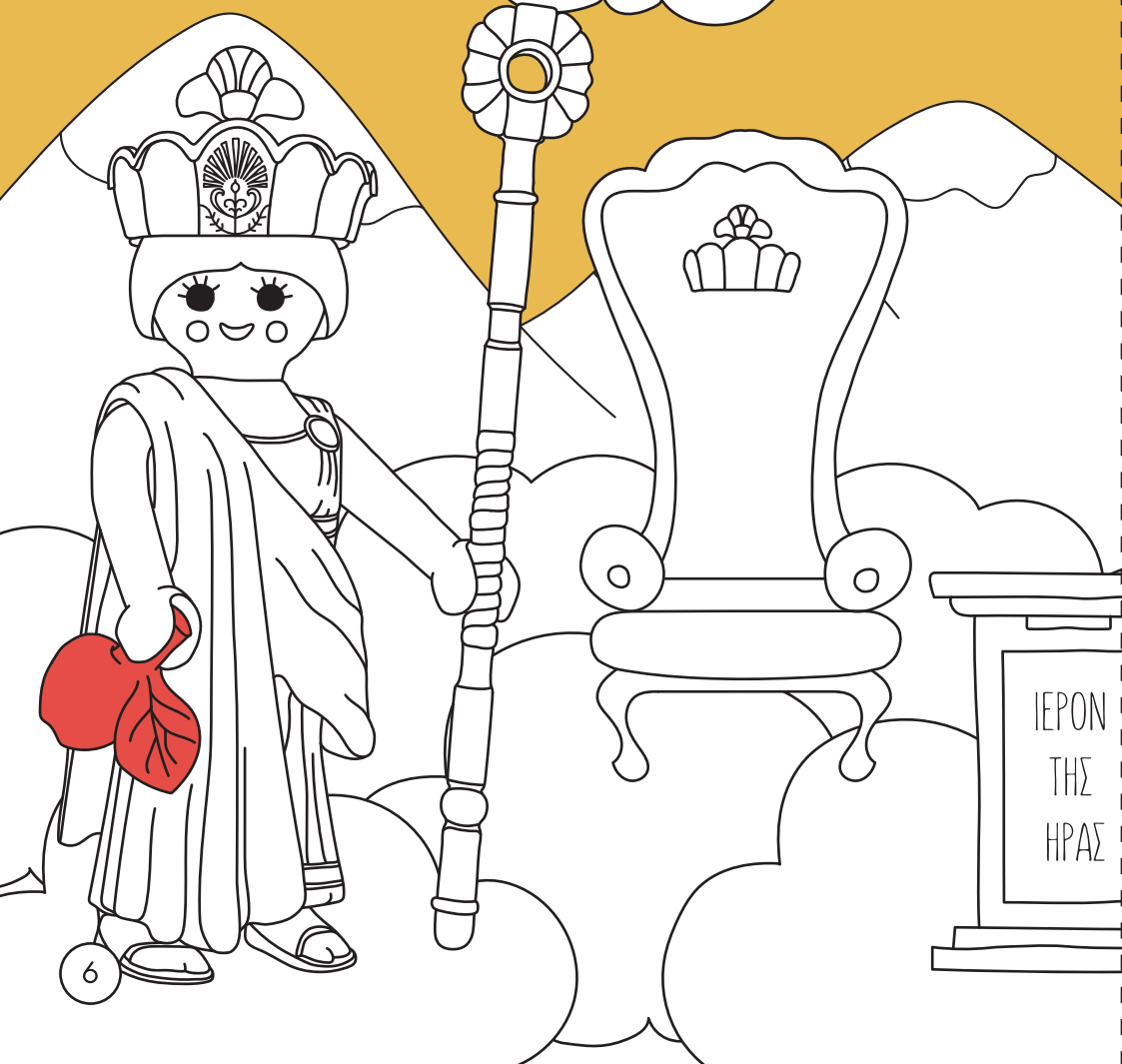

Hera's symbols are the peacock and the pomegranate, the fruit of fertility.

Hephaestus, the god of fire, volcanos and metalworking, is the son of Zeus and Hera. According to the ancient Greek mythology, when Hephaestus was born, Hera cast him off Olympus to the depths of the ocean, because he was ugly and deformed. There, he was found and raised by Eurynome and Thetis. He grew up to become a master blacksmith and crafted magnificent jewellery. Hera, upon discovering his talent, offered him back his seat among the other gods in Olympus!

Ares has lost his dog and is in a hurry to go fight! Help him find it by tracing the areas with dots and filling them in with colour.





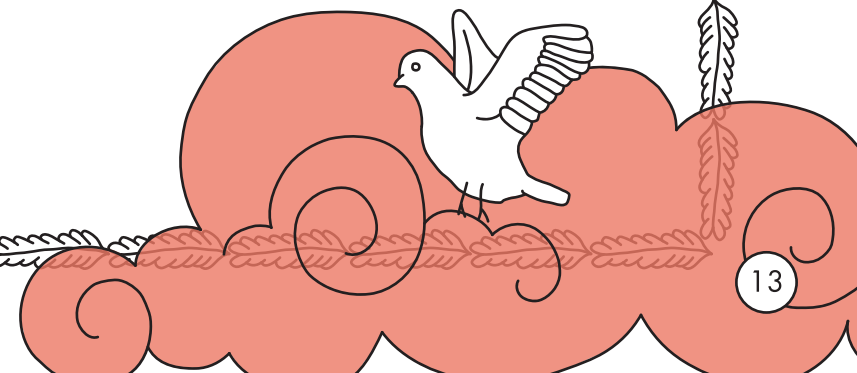

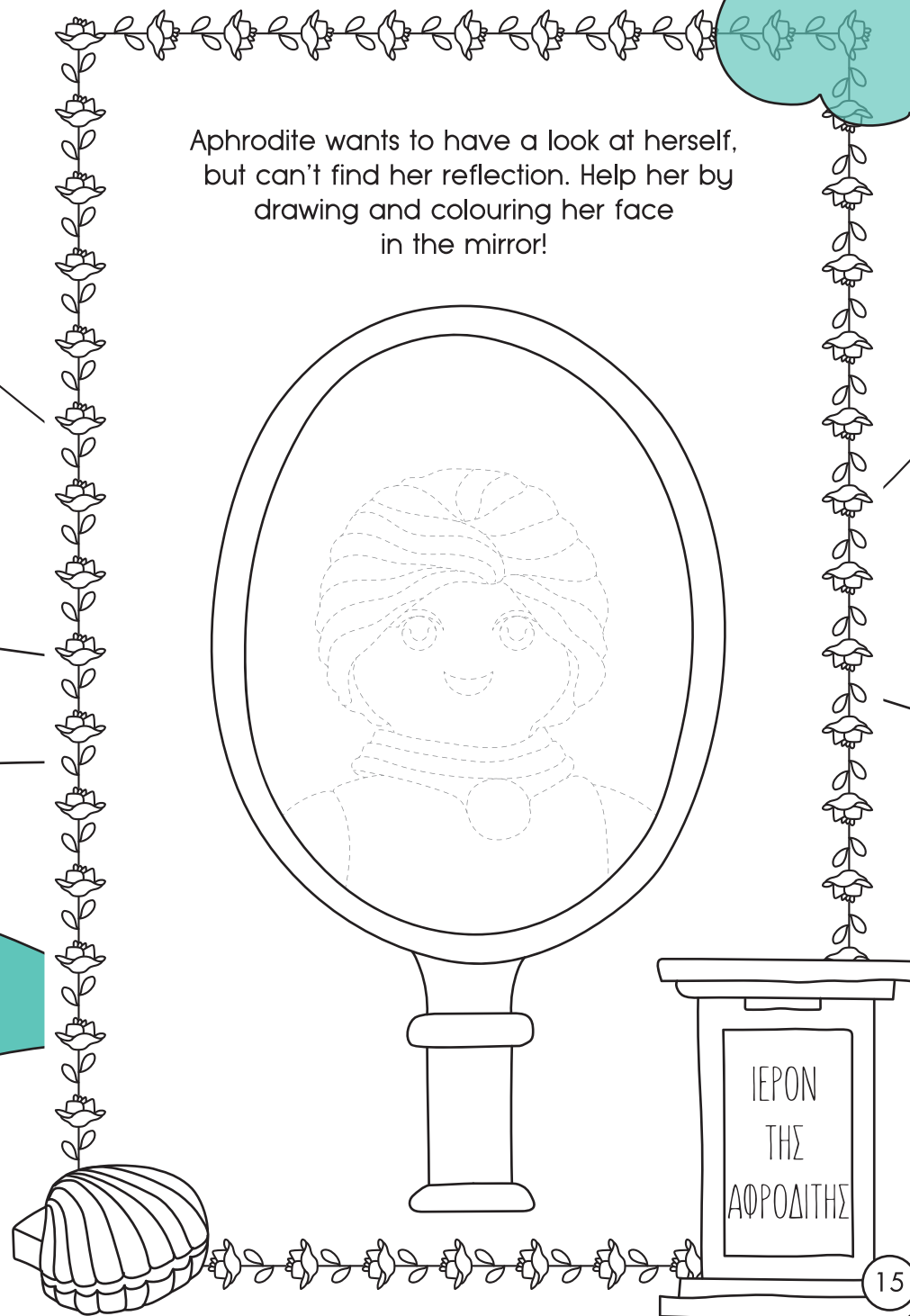
The room is dark and the light coming from the flame creates shadows on the house wall. Try to find which of the shadows belongs to Hestia.

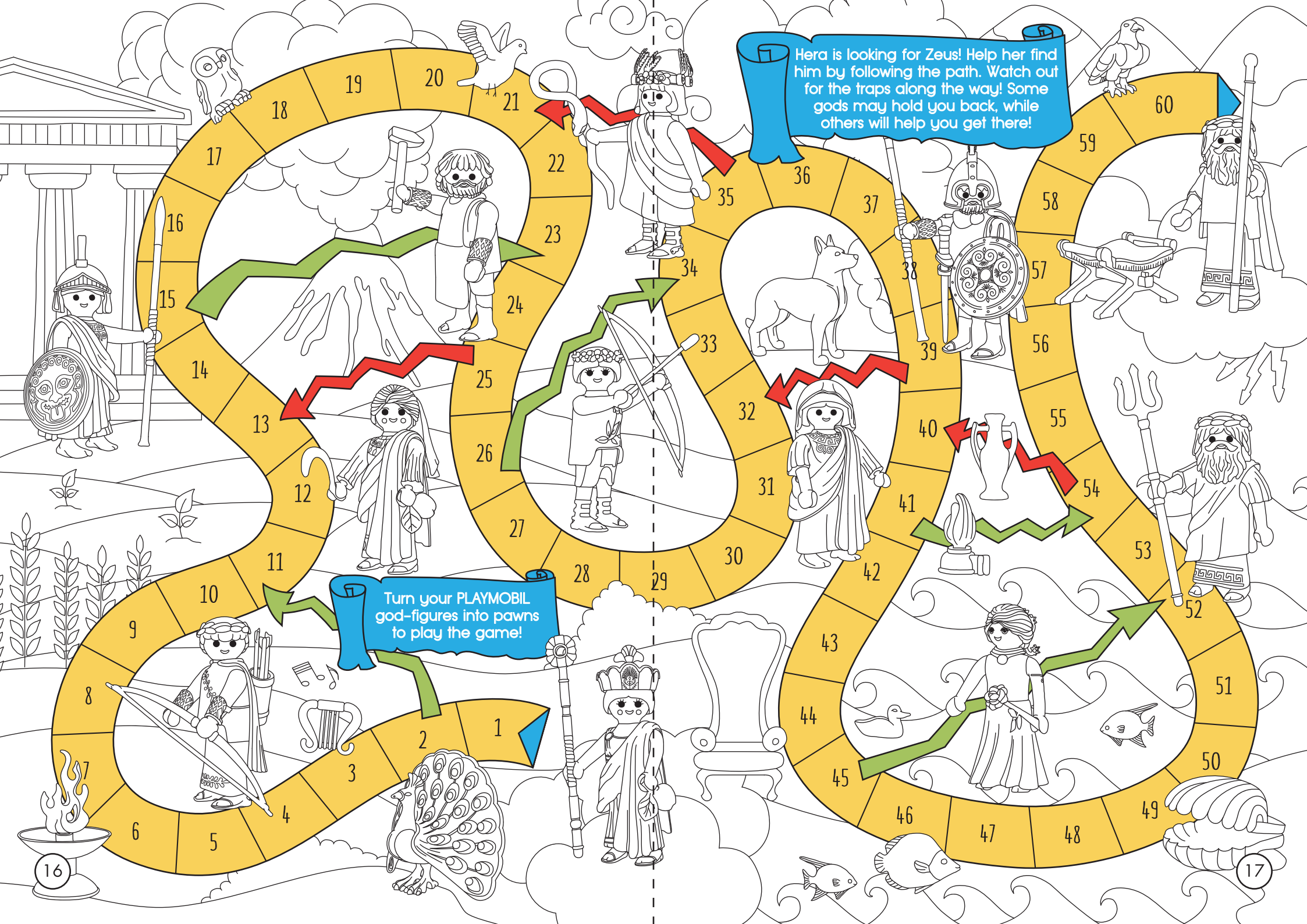
